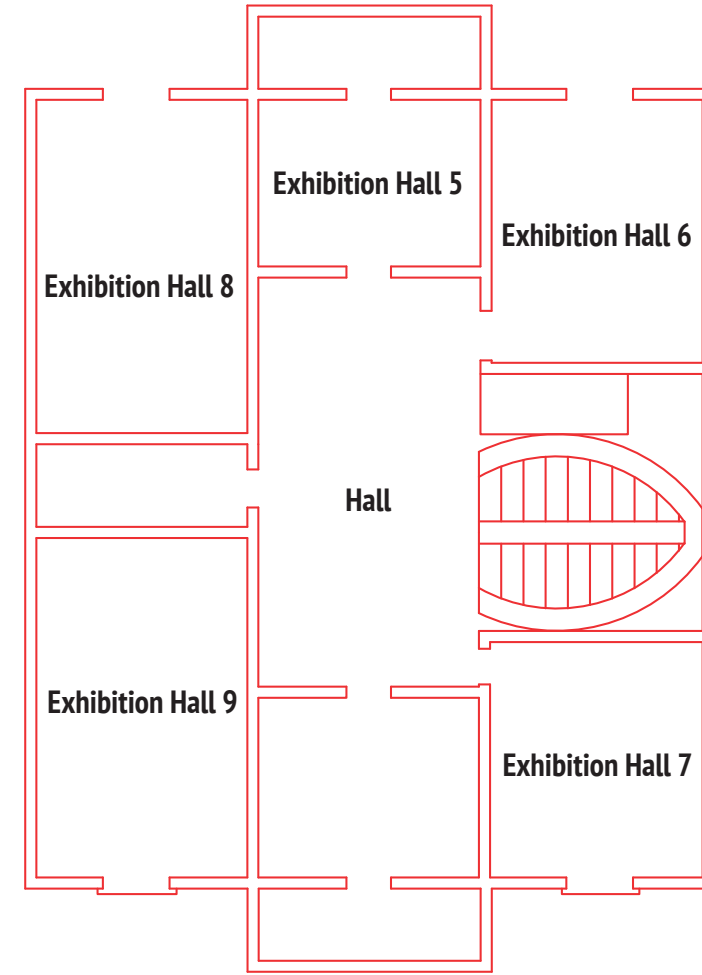

The Mudanya Armistice, which is an indication of the first political success of the Turkish Grand National Assembly Government, was signed at this house. The house, located in the center of the Mudanya district, dates from the end of the 19th century. The house, which belonged to the Russian-born Alexander Ganyanof, was later bought and repaired by Mudanian businessman Hayri Ipar and opened in 1937 as a museum directly under the Mudanya Municipality. In 1959 it was transferred to the General Directorate of Antiquities and Museums. On the first floor of the wooden house, which has two stories besides the basement and the attic, are the hall where the armistice was signed, and the study room of Ismet Pasha, and on the upper floor the bedrooms of Ismet Pasha and his aide-de-camp. In this house, where the objects from the time of the Armistice are kept, photographs and documents from that period are also on display.

The basement of the museum is the exhibition hall where temporary exhibitions are held.
