YALVAÇ MUSEUM

FROM THE NEOLITHIC TO THE PRESENT



The museum consists of two main parts: garden exhibition and indoor exhibition. Indoor exhibition is arranged in halls to display prehistoric artefacts, classical artefacts, ethnographic artefacts, and Hall of St. Paul. In the prehistoric artefacts hall, small artefacts from the Yalvaç area and from various excavations, as well as artefacts acquired from fellow citizens through donation and purchase are exhibited. There are several mammal fossils (Rhino-Ceratotherium, mammoth-Mastodon, horse-HippBarion, carnivores and cervidi-Bovidae), terracotta artefacts from the old Bronze Age and especially vases, bowls without handles and artefacts in different forms, ritual vessels such as, Dephas (amphikypellon) , rhytons, pottery bearing the effects of the Hittite period, (3rd-2nd millennium BCE) hand axes, various stamp seals, various heavy weights and brush used in the making of ceramics, Goddesses made of terracotta from the Neolithic to the old Bronze Ages in order to show the culture of the Mother Goddess, and terracotta and marble idols are exhibited in the display cases. In the Hall of classical artefacts, finds from the excavations at the Pisidia Antiochia and the Sanctuary of Men and artefacts donated by or purchased from individuals are displayed. The original marble monuments of the Antiochia School of sculpture, as well as the head and torso pieces of the colossal statues, Tyke, Nike God-Goddess sculptures, Imperial period portraits, marble cubes, glassware of civilizations of Kylix, Skyphos, Phiale, Lekythos, Aryballos, Askos, and late Hellenistic Period artefacts, terracotta and marble artefacts from the sanctuary of Men, a colossal statue of Zeus, Athena, Nike, Mousa sculptures dated to first century CE, Res Gestate Divi Augusti inscription, Pan figurine, various animal figurines are exhibited. The artefacts collected in Yalvaç and its surroundings are exhibited in the Ethnography Hall.
